BOARD OF HEALTH/ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES MAY 16, 2016

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by Dr. Lisa Kapler.

Agenda reviewed, Gail asked for the addition of Lisa and Peggy from NIACAO. Also for a change in the order of the agenda, item A. will be NIACAO and YTD budget will now be item E. Dr. Lisa Kapler also would like to add an item to the agenda. Item F. New Immunization Law. Motion made by Dave Tice to approve the agenda with the changes, seconded by Rosemary Tobin, motion carried.

Minutes from the March 21, 2016 meeting reviewed. Motion made by Rosemary Tobin to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Dave Tice, motion carried.

Gail Arjes, Floyd County Public Health/Home Health Care

Lisa Koppin from NIACAO presented data from programs offered by the agency to residents of Floyd County. Some changes have been made to WIC; recipients are now given an electronic card for their WIC benefit. This transition has gone smoothly for most. The breast feeding coalition is very active and will be having training on June 7th in Mason City. NIACAO continues with Family Planning and Maternal Care, Lisa read data, but will mail a hard copy of the data to reference.

Peggy Funk reviewed the I-Smile program along with data from the I-Smile at School program. Peggy will continue to do dental audits in all the Floyd County schools. Information was handed out in regards to Fluoride in water, not all towns in Floyd County have fluoridated water.



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Shelly Smith and Jan Streich presented a proposal to the Board in regards to sustaining and expanding the Nurtured Heart Program. The contract for Nurtured Heart would be \$50,000; this contract was originally held by Prairie Ridge. The Nurtured Heart Program aligns well with the results of the CHNA-HIP which was completed in 2015. The CHNA-HIP identified parenting skills as a community priority. Goals under the community priority include increase healthy behaviors in Floyd County through safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments for children. Strategies to achieve this goal include working with community partners to identify potential gaps and solutions. Motion made by Rosemary Tobin and seconded by Dave Tice to approve the contract with Gail also presenting to the Board of Supervisors, motion carried.

Gail informed the Board that Provider Insights is willing to complete agency chart audits due to the recent retirement of the previous auditor. Provider Insights is able to do both on site and off site chart audits. Charges vary on the number of charts being audited. Motion made by Dave Tice, seconded by Denise Pavlovich to approve Provider Insights for chart audits.

YTD budget reviewed, no concerns noted.


Dr. Kapler informed the Board of a new immunization law - Meningitis vaccination requires a student going into 7th grade to have received a Meningitis vaccination and a booster in 12th grade. Gail will keep the Board posted as a requirement date.

Jeff Sherman, Floyd County Sanitarian

YTD budget is at 81.6% for the year. Budget is going to be close depending on how many well test, well closing, and well rehabs he will have to pay for before July 1st.

Dangerous Dog Ordinance training that Jeff and Dave Tice attended was discussed. The Board has asked Jeff and Dave to work on an ordinance together to bring to the Board at the next meeting for discussion.

Two nuisance complaints were brought to the Board by Jeff to determine if there are steps he needed to take for each complaint. Jeff was directed by the Board to send a letter to the people that filed the first complaint to inform them that this issue had been resolved by the City of Charles City and there is nothing else for the Board of Health to do. The Board directed Jeff to send the property owner of the second property a letter outlining the violations and that it will need to be cleaned up.



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Jeff informed the Board about the number of complaints he had been getting from the public on the three new confinements that will be going up. One of three confinements is owned by Brandon & Casey Wood and they did attend the Board of Health meeting and talked about how they plan on planting trees around the buildings to help with odor.
