

Floyd County Board of Supervisors Meeting
October 3, 2016, 9:00 AM

UNAPPROVED MINUTES

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Board Room of the Floyd County Courthouse with the following in attendance: Supv Mark Kuhn, Roy Schwickerath, and Supv Doug Kamm.

Kamm/Schwickerath moved to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public comment: none

Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Supv Kamm attended a Chamber of Commerce meeting. Supv Schwickerath attended a County Social Services meeting, guided a flood tour with Senators Hogg and Wilhelm, and attended the Farm to Fork Dinner which Floyd County sponsored through its contribution to Healthy Harvest. Supv Kuhn acted as Incident Commander for the flood, attended an Area Development Corp meeting where they discussed a drainage issue and agreed to hire a firm to study the issue, and attended an FMC Governance Board meeting.

Raina Kellogg, Case Management Supervisor, presented information regarding hiring Angela Nelson as the Mental Health Advocate, replacing retiring Joan Van Zomeran. Nelson currently holds this position in Bremer, Butler, Clayton and Fayette counties. Fayette County is willing to be the employee of record, making Nelson a full-time employee if the county is interested in entering into an agreement to share the service which could possibly include Mitchell County as well. Discussion included concern of spreading the position to thin, coordination of court dates among all the counties, past and potential number of hours for the position, envisioning the role of the advocate would not do social worker but would rather call the county of residence if there is a need for a social worker, and the Iowa Code requirement of the advocate reporting to the Board of Supervisors and not the same agency that conducts social work. Since the retirement of Van Zomeran, Kellogg has been filling the advocate duties. Kellogg reported that Bob Lincoln, County Social Services Director, is working on wages and some sort of agreement for counties to sign. The Board would like to act on this at next Tuesday's board meeting.

The Board noted the following: Julie Eggena has been hired as a part time jailer with a starting wage of \$14.72 per hour and increasing to \$15.72 per hour upon becoming state certified; Jailer Luke Johnson's wage increases from \$14.72 per hour to \$15.72 per hour due to his recent state certification; Heather Faulkner, Assessor's Office Manager, received a wage 3% wage increase effective on the September 30 payroll due to successful completion of her 6-month probationary period; the Board of Health approved a salary increase for Jeff Sherman, County Sanitarian, putting his salary at \$47,476, up from \$43,657 and keeping him an exempt employee.

Future agenda items: 1) A Sheriff's Deputy would like to be on the agenda regarding a payroll error issue; 2) The Jail/Law Enforcement Center committee will be meeting the week of October 24; 3) The Engineer's plans for parking spaces in the Davico lot.

Schwickerath/Kamm moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
