

Floyd County Board of Supervisors Meeting
November 7, 2016, 9:00 AM

UNAPPROVED MINUTES

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Board Room of the Floyd County Courthouse with the following in attendance: Supv Mark Kuhn, Roy Schwickerath, and Supv Doug Kamm.

Kuhn/Schwickerath moved to amend the agenda to include discussion regarding signage for prohibition of weapons in the courthouse. Motion carried 3-0. Schwickerath/Kamm moved to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried 3-0.

Public comment: none

Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Supv Schwickerath attended the following meetings: Conservation Board where they discussed rates for row crop land renters, Foster Grandparents, E911 and Communications.

Randy Tilton, Assistant County Attorney, presented information regarding the prohibition of weapons signage in the courthouse. Tilton commented that he did not expand beyond the Floyd County Policy's exclusion to only law enforcement personnel carrying weapons and pointed out the difference between the county's policy and Chief Judge Wilke's order whereby Wilke's order allows Judicial Officers to possess a weapon. Tilton believes the county's policy would be governing because the Judge's order references "in the absence of a county ordinance, resolution or policy" and since the county has a policy it would be enforceable. Sheriff Rick Lynch suggested that verbiage be added to include to use the buzzer on ground floor to contact the Sheriff's Department for holders to buzz up to fourth floor to have access to a lock box to store weapons while in the courthouse. Supv Schwickerath suggested to have the county policy revised to include Judicial Officers as allowable carriers. Supv Kuhn has requested this be on the 2nd Judicial District Board meeting in December.

Mayors Trevis O'Connell (Floyd), George Anderson (Nora Springs), Jeff Wright (Colwell), Sheriff Rick Lynch, Deputy Jeff Crooks, and the Board discussed renewing the 28E Law Enforcement agreement. The current rate is \$4 per capita. Discussion included extending the contract to two years instead of one.

Sherri Boedeker, Elderbridge Agency on Aging Fiscal Director, and Lori Hain, Floyd County Advisory Board representative, presented their annual report ending June 30, 2016. The FY18 funding request is \$12,266.40.

Supv Schwickerath and Auditor Gloria Carr provided information from the Jail/Law Enforcement Committee and a recommendation to enter into an agreement with the City of Charles City to hire Prochaska Architects to proceed with the next phase of the study.

Future agenda items: none discussed

Kamm/Schwickerath moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
