

Floyd County Board of Supervisors Meeting
October 9, 2018, 9:00 AM

UNAPPROVED MINUTES

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Board Room of the Floyd County Courthouse with the following in attendance: Supv Linda Tjaden, Supv Mark Kuhn, and Supv Doug Kamm.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public comment: Supv Tjaden commented about the effect the current weather patterns have had on work that needs to be done this season; there is roughly 320,000 farm acres in Floyd County, approximately 1/3 soybeans and 2/3 corn, estimated at \$165 million in inventory sitting in fields.

Kuhn/Kamm moved to approve the September 24 and 25, 2018 meeting minutes. Motion carried 3-0.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the claims presented: County#847-999 and Secondary Roads 19502-19542. Motion carried 3-0.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the 28E Cooperative Agreement Between the City of Charles City, Iowa, and the Iowa County of Floyd for the county treasurer to collect and enforce delinquent parking tickets on behalf of a city in conjunction with renewal of vehicle registrations pursuant to Iowa Code Section 421.40(7) and 321.236. Motion carried 3-0.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the amended Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Center 28E Agreement. Motion carried 3-0.

Kuhn/Kamm moved to approve the Floyd County Procurement Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the Floyd County Code of Conduct Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to approve the Floyd County Reporting Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Engineer Report: Rolando provided his timesheet and foreman's notes. Rolando requested signatures for the plans for 195th St bridge project. Grain hauling/semi traffic on Quarry Road has extended around the corner to Mulcahy's property; discussion included the safety concerns on the road, erecting No Parking signs, the length of time grain haulers park on the road, and having this as a formal agenda item with Frank Blain, Valero representative invited to the meeting. The 170th St bridge project will likely not be completed this year; possibly work could be done to allow opening the east/west road, wrap up dirt work for erosion control, and then shut the project until Spring. PCI hopes to set the culvert for the day labor project on Victory Ave. Crews have been blading in between rain showers. Rolando has not yet been contacted regarding a FEMA meeting.

Kamm/Kuhn moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
